40 Years of Memories

by Vince Dooley

I have been asked many times to reflect on some of my remembrances of Sanford Stadium during my 40 years as coach and athletic director.

The first time I saw the stadium, I remember thinking to myself how magnificent the setting was resting peacefully and harmoniously in the Tanyard Creek valley. At the same time, it was obvious that the stadium needed a lot of work. The wooden seats were old and splitting and many a fan wrote in complaining of getting splinters! The worst part of the stadium at the time, however, was the old light poles anchored on the field that caused many of our fans to have to look around the poles to follow the game. The first thing we did was to cover the splintering seats with a plastic surface that really helped. We also took down the old light posts and moved them to the practice field where they stayed before we replaced them in 2003.

In my first year as head coach in 1964, the capacity of the stadium was 43,621 permanent seats. I am proud to say that today the capacity is 92,746, including 77 SkySuites that have been added since the decade of the 1990's.

A point of pride for me is that each and every addition we have made to Sanford Stadium has always been in harmony with the original stadium, maintaining our belief that Sanford Stadium is the most beautiful spectator stadium in the world.

People have also asked, what are your greatest memories of games you coached between the hedges? I coached 140 games in Sanford Stadium. Each held a lot of memories- mostly good, but some bad. However, six special memories quickly come to mind.

The first is the Georgia Tech game that we won my first year, which broke a losing streak with Tech and sent us to the Sun Bowl. At that particular time after three losing seasons, most Georgia people felt as if we had won the national championship.

The following year in the 1965 opening game, we beat No. 1-ranked Alabama in a tremendous upset by scoring late on the so-called "flea flicker" – Kirby Moore to Pat Hodgson to Bob Taylor for a 70-yard touchdown play. Moore then hit Hodgson for the winning two-point conversion and the victory.

In 1976, the year of our fourth SEC championship, it was an Alabama game again that provided the highlights as we shut out the Crimson Tide 21-0. I will never forget the 15,000 people who sat out on the railroad track the night before in order to earn "squatter's rights" to see the game from that vantage point in the west end zone. I don't believe there has never been a celebration quite like the one in Athens following that game.

The most exciting game I can recall is when we beat Georgia Tech 29-28 in 1978. We were down 20-0, made a great comeback, and after the lead changed hands four times, we won on a last-minute touchdown and two-point play.

The 1981 Auburn game in which our team clinched the SEC championship was another very special remembrance. It was the first time that Georgia had ever won back-to-back SEC championships, and the first and only time in my career that we won the crown in Athens. All of the previous championship games that we won were in Auburn.

Finally how can I forget the '88 game, my last "between the hedges," when we beat Georgia Tech. That was the 200th win for the teams I coached.

Those are only a few, but, wow, what great memories!

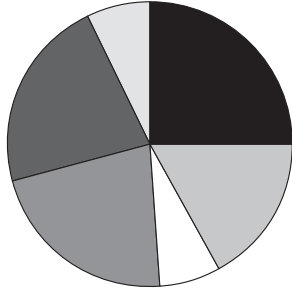

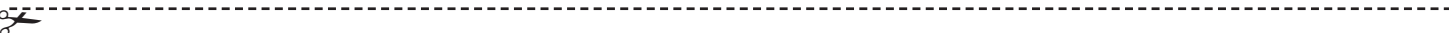

Joseph Jackura

Joseph Jackura, Jr., beloved husband, father and grandfather, passed away in Boca Raton, Florida, on November 21, 2004 after a lengthy illness. He is greatly missed by his family who would like to honor him by noting the many accomplishments and achievements of his 78 years of life.

Joseph graduated from Washington High School, East Chicago, Indiana, where he lettered in football and earned a sports scholarship to the University of Georgia, Athens, Georgia, in 1944. While at the University of Georgia, Joseph played Center for Coach Wallace Butts and earned his letter each of the 4 years he played, 1944, 1947, 1948, and 1949. He was a member of the "G" Club and Lambda Chi Alpha Fraternity and graduated in 1950 with a Bachelor's Degree in Education. After graduation, Joseph continued his education at Vanderbilt University, and in later years, went on to earn his Bachelor of Law Degree from John Marshall University in Atlanta, Georgia.

After graduation from the University of Georgia, Joseph taught and coached at Rome High School in Rome, Georgia, and in later years taught at Macon Junior College, Macon, Georgia, and although he enjoyed the educational field, he eventually left to pursue his career in Insurance and Law and eventually owned his own business in Macon.

In 1993, Joseph was chosen by the Mayor and City of East Chicago, Indiana to be a member in the Sports Section of the East Chicago, Indiana "Hall of Fame". He was inducted in a moving ceremony commemorating him and a few other sports greats who were "congratulated on the esteem honor of being the very best." This recognition delighted him as much in 1993 as did the recognitions he received at the University of Georgia such as "G" Club Outstanding Lineman of 1948, and Georgia Interception Records "Most Per Game, 3, Georgia vs. Alabama, 1948" and "Longest Interception Return, 80 yards, Georgia vs. Alabama, 1948." In fact, during this same game, the interception return was for a touchdown, an unheard of accomplishment for a Center!

Over the years, Joseph was a member of the NEA, member and President of the REA, member of the Lions Club, and of the Elks Club, and served his community with great enthusiasm. These affiliations were a natural extension of Joseph's fierce patriotic loyalty, which began when at the age of 17 in 1944; he lied about his age in order to enlist in the United States Marine Corps. He was stationed in the South China Seas during World War II, and although he was proud of being a Marine, he seldom spoke of the atrocities of the War in later years.

Joseph was a devoted husband to his wife, Georgia, who he met 57 years ago while they were both students at the University of Georgia. They married in 1948, had their first child, Lynn, in 1949 during their Senior year, and their second child, Andrew, in 1957, in Tallahassee, Florida. In addition to Georgia, Lynn and Andrew, Joseph is survived by four grandchildren, Zachary, Kalie, Anna and Michael, three sisters, Dorothy, Mary and Anastasia, a brother, George and numerous nieces and nephews.

Joseph was an intelligent, warm and outgoing person. A true Renaissance man whose many interests and pleasures included sports, the Civil War, reading, working crossword puzzles, and smoking cigars. He was laid to rest on December 6, 2004, with a flag-draped casket, a bugler playing "Taps", and a Military Guard in Bonaventure Cemetery, Savannah, Georgia.

With love and respect we remember you.
