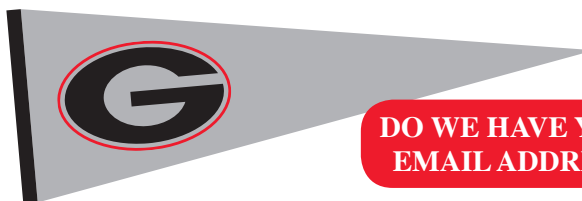

## John Rauch Loyalty Award Winners *from the Winter 2014 Wally's Boys Newsletter*

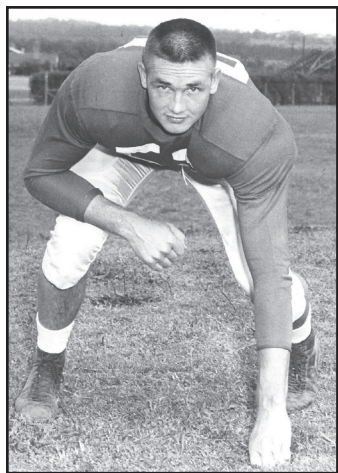

They have been long time participants in the Wally's Boys association. They are loyal Wally's Boys and have been season ticket buyers for Georgia football for years. Congratulations and thanks to each of these winners for his many years of support of our association.

**Matthew Arthur**, born in Alabama, grew up in Fitzgerald. Following graduation he became a career educator serving as a teacher, coach, principal and finishing his career as Superintendent of the Houston County School System. He has the distinction of having an elementary school named for him, a high honor indeed. In 2007, the UGA Chapter of the National Football Foundation honored him and his son, Matthew, for post graduate achievement, the only father-son awards ever given by the chapter.

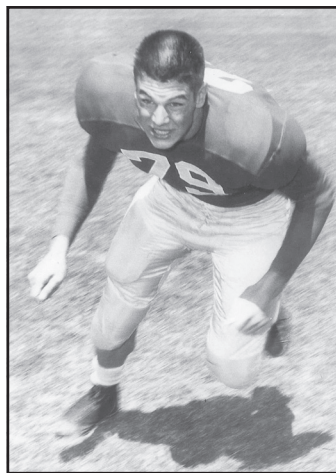
**Tony Cushenberry** grew up in Albany and played high school football under Bernie Reid, who played for Coach Butts. Tony played both ways and the Green Bay Packers offered him a contract. But Tony traded football for flying. He became a fighter pilot in the U.S. Air Force. He flew F-105s in Southeast Asia where he logged a total of 125 combat missions against heavily defended targets in North Vietnam. He was inducted into the Georgia Aviation Hall of Fame.

**Walter White** was reared in Toccoa. Following graduation from Georgia, he was an officer in the U.S. Army and then embarked on a professional career which included stints with Coca-Cola, Pepsi and the last 20 years with Coke again. Walter was a highly regarded manager and executive for Coca-Cola's overseas operations in Europe. He gained high praise in the company for his management and organizational skills.

**George Whitton** is a Columbus native and following graduation he became an infantry officer in the Army which led to joining the Special Forces. "I have to say," Whitton smiles, "that in all my training in the Infantry, Airborne and Green Berets, nothing compared to the 'two-a-day' training on Ag Hill under Coach Butts." George served in England and Germany during his military career. He made a total of 75 jumps.



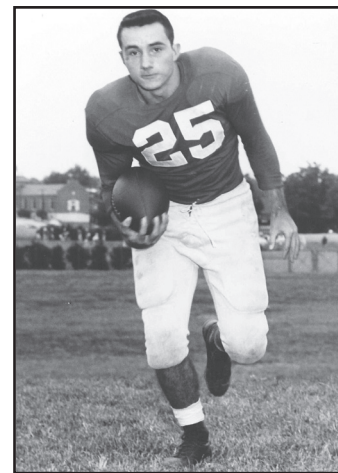

## “Confidence Because of His Sacrifice”

### Good Friday Message

Have you ever gone into see someone and you were really nervous about it because the person held a really important position? Perhaps you remember a time when you were at work and “the big boss” whoever that was came by and things were not going quite the way it should have been going and you were afraid you were going to get the blame.

I have been there on more than one occasion. I think I have told you this story before. When I was in the third grade we had received our report cards. I took mine home and got it signed but then I lost it before I got back to school. When it was time to turn them back into the teacher I had to report to her that I had gotten it signed but then had lost it. I don't know whether the teacher believed I lost it after it was signed or that I had thrown it away before I got it signed. At any rate, she said go to the Principal's office and tell Mrs. Wise what you have done. I had never been sent to the Principal's office before, but I had heard what it was like. She had a paddle that she used on kids and if you were really bad she had an electric paddle and sometimes she would attach thumb tacks to it. Naturally, I was scared to death. I went to the office and said I need to see Mrs. Wise because I lost my report card. The secretary ushered me in to see her. I will never forget her response. She said, Howard it's alright. We will make you another one. The only thing you have to do is bring a dime tomorrow to pay for the new one. Now I can't imagine that the report card cost a dime, but she was letting me know I needed to be more responsible and keep up with important things like report cards. I left there knowing that Mrs. Wise was not a mean lady, but she really cared about her students. I never believed those reports about paddles any more. I knew if I needed her for any reason I could go into her office and tell her the truth and she would help me.

As most of you know, when I was in college I was manager for the football team. My senior year I worked with the Offensive Line. My friend who played football and came to church for about a year while he worked in Richmond was one of the players I worked with. One of the drills the linemen had to do was hit a five man sled and push it up against the concrete wall that surrounded the practice field. That sled would leave the ground and be 2-3 feet or more off the ground on the front. It was my job to move that sled with the help of some machinery every few days so that the field would not get chopped up and so that the wall would not be weakened. One day the guys were not giving as much as the Coach wanted and he told them to hit the sled harder. One of his favorite sayings was, “That wouldn't break an egg.” He then said to them I want you to hit that sled so hard you will knock the wall down. Now behind the wall was a 12-15 foot hill and at the foot of the hill were cars that were parked. You know what I was thinking. Then he looked at me and said, “Howard, don't move this sled again until they knock this wall down.” He knew what my job was, but now I had direct orders, given to me in front of my team mates. I did not move the sled. Everyday they hit that sled. Every day that sled hit the wall. Everyday that wall rocked. Everyday that wall rocked a little more. Every day I became more nervous. Everyday they hit that sled a little harder. One day as they were hitting the sled and as the wall was rocking, the Athletic Director walked out on to the field. Now for those of you who don't know that person is the individual who is over the Head Football Coach. Coach Eaves was a former basketball player at Auburn University and then the basketball coach. He was a tall man and very distinguished. He also did not waste money or words. Fortunately for me, and the linemen, our coach looked over and saw him. He quickly ended that drill and moved onto another. Later in practice, again in front of his players he said, “Howard, tomorrow move that sled. Two days later there was a work crew pouring concrete to hold iron poles with a huge piece of iron later welded to the bars for that sled to hit when they raised it off of the ground. Then they poured asphalt and installed a strip of turf for the guys to push their feet against so they wouldn't churn up the dirt. I am sure my coach had a talk with Coach Eaves and they determined that might cost a little money, but better than replacing a concrete wall and fixing several cars that the wall came crashing down on top of. None of us ever forgot that episode.

I tell that story because I could just see myself having to go and explain my actions to Coach Eaves. Instead, Coach McDuffie had a conversation with him and I never had to go and explain anything.

That is similar to what Jesus did on the cross. He did not give us instruction to sin. In fact he taught us how to keep from sinning. But he knew that we were going to disappoint him. He knew we were going to sin. When we fall short of his will, Jesus goes to the big boss, God himself and says Father, whatever you had in mind for Howard, you give me the punishment instead. He is mine. I am responsible for him. I take full responsibility for his actions.



Because of Jesus' acting on our behalf we have the ability to enter the presence of God with full confidence that he loves us and he has forgiven us.

I never got called into Coach Eaves office over that incident or any other incident. I can tell you I was afraid I was going to be called to his office, until I saw the work that was being done for that sled. At that point I knew Coach McDuffie had my back. I knew he was not going to let me take the fall for that wall rocking and possibly falling.

If a human being will do that. If a coach will be an intermediary between someone he is responsible for and his boss, how much more will Jesus do that for you and me. We can certainly enter God's presence with confidence that he loves us and he wants us to be there.

Coach Eaves never mentioned that incident to me. He never treated me any differently after that wall incident. He could have, but he didn't. I don't know that Coach McDuffie talked to him about me, but I do know I never had to give an account for my actions. I think that it is way it will be with the Father. When we own up to our mistakes, he forgives us. There are consequences for our actions, just like with loosing my report card. Jesus also acts on our behalf to take plead our case with the father. God then welcomes us into his presence as one of his children because Jesus has spoken to him on our behalf.

That is what Good Friday is about. Jesus took our punishment for us. He took the pain and suffering that we deserved. He was willing to give the ultimate sacrifice, his life for you and me. Who are you willing to die for? Perhaps a few family members? Perhaps one or two close friends? Jesus was willing to die for sinners of all types. You know the sinner and he died for them. While no sin is worse than another, Jesus was willing even to die for those who commit what we would consider horrible sins. Yes he was even willing to die for the likes of Hitler, bin Laden, whoever your worst enemy is. Yes, he was even willing to die for you. Even if individuals weren't willing to accept Christ as their Savior, he died for them. They just didn't receive the free gift he offered to them. What about you? Have you accepted the gift of his sacrifice on Calvary?

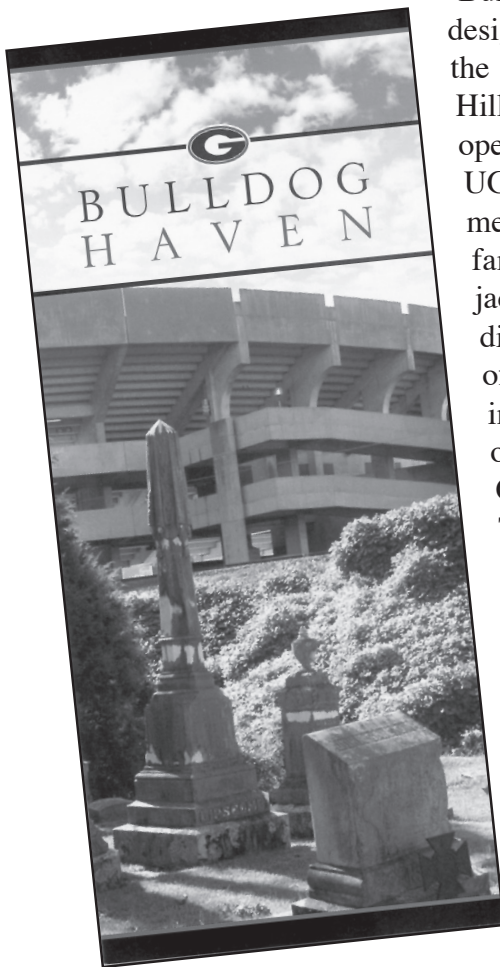
