How the Georgia Football Lettermen's Club got started!

By Dick Conn (1971-72-73)

Robert Honeycutt and I were freshman in 1969. That's when you had to play freshman ball and couldn't play on the varsity. Robert ended up lettering in 1970, 71 and 72 and was captain of the 72 team. I was redshirted and lettered in 1971, 72 and 73. After graduating, Robert started a career in the trucking business while I went to the NFL for 6 years. In 1981 I moved to Spartanburg, SC to work for Jostens, the class ring and graduation supply company. I was glad to be back closer to Athens so I could start going to the games and hang out with my friends and teammates. I talked to Robert and some other teammates, Andy Johnson, who was still playing ball but knew he would be coming home soon, Jim Curington and Chris Hammond among others about how they got together at the games. There didn't seem to be a good way to meet up so we started trying to meet up in the old McWhorter Hall parking lot over by the baseball field. After a while Robert and I said there had to be a better way for our lettermen to get together. We decided to call Coach Dooley and make an appointment to talk to him about a way to get us all together at the games. Coach Dooley was glad that we wanted to get the guys together. He said we could use the old Alumni building parking lot across from the practice field and that he would pay for a bus to get in line behind the team buses at the Butts-Mehre for the old lettermen to follow the team over to the stadium. Shortly

on game days he and I would get there early and put our sign up and try to make sure only Football lettermen were getting in the parking lot. People would pull up and Robert would say, "Are you a letterman"? If they said no we turned them away. We realized that we didn't know every letterman so we had lettermen's cards printed so they could get in the lot. Well after a few weeks, it got back to Coach Dooley that we were turning away some big alumni that had been parking there for years. Coach called us in and said "what

are you guys doing turning away these big alums that had parked there forever!!!" We said if they were not a letterman we told them to hit the road. That didn't go over very well so we had to tone it down. After a season, Coach Dooley helped us organize the club and form a board. Neither Robert nor I lived in Athens so Coach Dooley said I know who we need. He got a player from his first team who was a businessman in Athens to be the first President of the club—Leroy Dukes! Leroy was a great choice and led the club to become the best football lettermen's club in the country. Mack Guest is now the president and is only the second president in the club's history. Sally Haugabook has been the only assistant to the president for 20 years and really helps us to stay current and informed. The club continues to grow and Coach Dooley is still very supportive! The Athletic Department is also very involved and helps us to remain the best Football Lettermen's Club in the country!! Other clubs have come to us for advice to get their clubs going but there is only one BEST CLUB. Always and forever, GO DAWGS!!!

The team would get out and go to the locker room and we would cheer them on and go to our new lettermen's club! It felt like old times riding the bus to the stadium just like the players! The 1971 team went 11-1, which is tied for the 3rd best winning percentage of the past 49 teams. Their offense was ranked 8th nationally in rushing and still holds one of the UGA rushing records.

Honoring “The Five” at UGA’s 50th anniversary was a momentous and tremendous occasion. Having time to reflect back on what was taking place, I am truly humbled and grateful. I was so filled and overwhelmed with emotions that it was difficult to process at the time just what I was feeling. The celebration encompassed over three days. Each day kept building on the previous day and outdoing the next moment. Starting with our induction at the College Football Hall of Fame, as if that was not enough of a “WOW” moment in itself. Then on Friday, came the unveiling of five separate monuments on UGA’s campus (full body) and a dinner celebration. I must admit that, “I didn’t cry, but my eyes became misty.” That was an amazing moment! Saturday, game time at Sanford Stadium, and going before the fans brought back such wonderful memories.

To think that our navigating troubling times, working hard in maintaining focus to achieve our primary purpose in attending UGA, which was to get an education. You see, football was the carrot that got us to the university. The ultimate goal was achieving an education.
